John H. E. Fried Memorial Fellowships in International Human Rights

The Fried fellowship honors the memory of international human rights expert John H. E. Fried by awarding a grant to an advanced Ph.D. student in political science to conduct research on international human rights. The \$5,000.00 award is given to foster original research and analysis that results in a conference paper, published article, dissertation proposal or dissertation chapter dealing with the causes of or possible solutions to human rights violations as well as strategies for promoting international human rights. The applicant should approach these issue from the perspective of comparative or international politics, organizations, or law. Applicants should submit a short proposal (not more than 1,000 words), a current curriculum vitae, and a transcript no later than **1 March 2020**. In addition, brief confidential letters of recommendation from two faculty members who are familiar with the proposal should be sent separately before the deadline. The George D. Schwab Fellowship in American Foreign Policy

The Schwab fellowship was established by an anonymous donor to honor George Schwab, the former president of the National Committee on American Foreign Policy. An annual award of \$2,000 is available for costs related to dissertation research relevant to a topic that leads to an improved understanding of U.S. foreign policy. Applicants should submit a short proposal (not more than 1,000 words), a current curriculum vitae, and a transcript no later than **1 March 2020**. In addition, one confidential letter of recommendation from a faculty member who is familiar with the proposal should be sent separately before the deadline.
