The Linguistics Program at the Graduate Center is designed to provide students with well-grounded training in general linguistics and a wide choice of specialized sub-disciplines. Our PhD. and M.A. programs prepare students for careers in scientific research, teaching, private industry and public planning. We offer coursework, laboratory experience, and research supervision in theoretical, experimental, descriptive and applied linguistics. PhD. candidates master the discipline of linguistics in its broadest sense, acquire knowledge of a specialized area, and perform independent research, while M.A. students may have a narrower, more descriptive, or critical focus. All graduate students work under close guidance from faculty members of their choice. Our faculty members are internationally recognized for their research expertise including:

- sentence processing
- first and second language acquisition
- bilingualism and multilingualism
- neurolinguistics
- sociolinguistics
- computational linguistics
- endangered languages
- historical linguistics
- linguistic typology
- phonetics; phonology; morphology
- semantics; and syntax.

Interdisciplinary work is strongly encouraged, and a number of Linguistics faculty hold joint appointments in other programs, including:
